Jerome Johnson is the creative director of the Garfield Farm Museum in Campton Hills. Garfield Farm Museum is a living history farm that preserves the original 1840s farmstead. Jerome's presentation, "Heirloom Plants and Loss of Genetic Diversity in Domestic Cultivars," will be an introduction to the loss of genetic diversity in the plants that we humans depend on. Learn about how planting heirloom plants can increase genetic diversity.

Garfield Farm Museum offers a variety of educational, family, and entertainment events.
Seminars are held on such

topics as prairie, woodlands, and wetlands management; bat and blue bird box construction; and fruit tree grafting. Specials shows bring rare breed livestock, heirloom garden products and seeds, and collections



of antique farm tools. Prairie walks are conducted monthly. And there are social events like barn dances and a candlelight tavern reception at the Inn in December. It is in Campton Hills,IL on Garfield Road just north of Illinois Route 38 between Geneva and Elburn. You can find out more about the museum at www.garfieldfarm.org

Terror in the Neighborhood

I looked out my window to watch the wrens raising their second brood of the season. Yikes! The bird house was swinging like crazy and four wrens were chattering, scolding and frantically dive-bombing some critter,

Was the predator a squirrel or maybe a weasel? According to my Field Guide, it actually looked more like a mink! The coloring and body length seemed right. My neighbor, an expert nature observer, said she's occasionally seen both

weasels and minks. A cashier at Prosecks, who volunteers at Willowbrook Wildlife Center, said it could have been a mink.

The baby wrens survived the terror and within an hour the parents resumed feeding their chicks. I also observed one parent remove a fecal sac. That attack surely caused the little ones to poop.

Weasels are wholly carnivorous, preying mainly on mice, but also rabbits, chipmunks and birds, including poultry. They will climb 15-20' up a tree after a squirrel. The Least Weasel is the smallest carnivore in North America.


Tickets are \$5.00 each and can be purchased at the entrance of the Kruse House on the day of the event.
