Editor's Note: Since we don't publish a Garden Club Newsletter in December, this article is a little late; but we still wanted to share it with our members.

When my granddaughter, Solace (3 years old) visited last summer, she'd become so charming and verbal! As we chatted moving from place to place indoors, she'd stop moving to say "I did not know that!"

That's how I felt when Amazon left a 5 foot cylindrical box on the porch on December 17th from Willard Orchards. It was an "I did not know that" moment. It was a dormant 5ft Rising Sun Redbud with a 10in root ball all nicely wrapped. Guess I had ordered it on August 16th, forgotten about it and here it came. After all the bulbs are planted; the door had closed in my mind for outside planting this year.

When I called the nursery to ask whether I should pot plant it to overwinter in the greenhouse (32-65° nights) or in the heated garage, the answer was "Hold on a minute...", " oh you should have 50° weather on Christmas day in Illinois and your ground is not frozen, so plant it in the yard."

So here's what I had not thought about. In Georgia the nursery waited until the tree was dormant there and still time

to replant in zone 5b or 6a to keep the dormancy until spring comes. No point confusing the tree with a temperature increase inside anywhere (greenhouse with lights or dark garage). So after a sumptuous Christmas meal prepared (hopefully), it will be Redbud tree planting time. "I did not think about that" as Solace would say. Happy Holidays to all!
