It's time for Fall Bulb Orders

It's been the tradition of West Chicago Garden Club to pay shipping on members' orders placed through the club. Shipping is 15%, and the club will cover up to \$15 in shipping costs per member order. So if you order over \$100 of bulbs, then you may need to pay some of the shipping! You will still be responsible for taxes.

We will be ordering through John Scheepers (retail), johnscheepers.com, and Van Engelen (wholesale), vanengelen.com. Although minimum quantities may be larger on the wholesale site, that is not always the case. However,

wholesale prices will always be less, even if the minimum quantity is the same as the retail minimum quantity. So, before letting me know what you want, check both sites. **DO NOT PLACE YOUR ORDER THROUGH THE WEBSITES**. If you do, the club will not pay your shipping. AND THIS YEAR THERE WILL ALSO BE A 6% TARIFF CHARGE. If things change on that front, they will let us know.

All orders should be sent to Pauline by July 31st, with a subject line of Bulb Order. If you don't receive an email back from me within a couple days saying I received your order, please resend your email. Bulbs should arrive by the October Bulb Bingo meeting. Payment will be expected then.


News from Kruse

Growing Native—Why a Master Naturalist recommends iNaturalist! Ruth Gauss

Hi, gardening friends! I have a recommendation for a great tool for identifying plants and other living things that also allows you to possibly contribute as a citizen scientist to research. It's an app called iNaturalist and I love it. I don't like to add apps to my phone, but this is one that I feel like I should have installed when it was first recommended to me.

I'm going to share the basics here and if you see me at a meeting or on Twilight Tuesday I'd be happy to share how I use the app with you in person or try to help you if you are having any issues.


You do need to register an account to fully use the iNaturalist app and what I really like is that you can also see lots on their website—this is helpful for exploring and seeing details more closely than possible on a phone screen. Here are my <u>Observations</u> (posts with pictures I have taken) from the past 13 months that I've used the app.


I was recently exploring a garden and found a fern I wanted to try and ID. It was quick and easy to make the ID using iNaturalist. I clicked on the "share" symbol on my phone's photo album while I was viewing the picture of the fern (first picture below). I chose the iNaturalist app from the list of apps and it brought a very small thumbnail image into the app form for submission (picture 2). Right under the thumbnail is where you will want to tap in order to see the suggestions by the AI that evaluates the plant or animal based on what is seen in the image along with the date, time, and location where the picture was taken. (You can add the date, time, and location by clicking on the appropriate line if that information wasn't included with your image's data. You will get much better results with this information entered before clicking "what did you see?") The AI will give its best guess, in this case it was a Sensitive Fern—which was the only species that it found. When I clicked through the description, looked through the images, and checked the Map of Observations I determined that it was most likely a Sensitive Fern. You can click on the check button if you don't need to investigate further (circled on image 3) or you can click on the big green "Select" button on image 4 if you chose to investigate before choosing your ID.

Click the green check at the bottom of the Observation (picture 2) and you'll allow others to see your Observation and they can confirm if your ID was correct (or provide more insight in you were only confident to Genus). I've learned so much just from using the app to try and ID plants and animals I find. The fact that there is a whole community of people adding their Observations is so wonderful and makes using the app more interesting.

I hope this helps you when you are in your own native garden and also out exploring! Happy (native) gardening!
