An Outstanding Year in the Garden

Yes indeed. It has been an outstanding year in the garden. From tree trimming in March to gathering the plant supports for winter storage in October. The dahlia even bloomed before it froze (see picture on 🕮 **(\$** page 5)! The garden was never too much trouble. It needed us, but not obsessively. Most of the 😆 time it looked good and we never failed to enjoy our initial tour on work days. The garden has grown on us.....we appreciate it more over time and the garden continues to mature.
