Please bring an appetizer, salad, side dish, or dessert to share. It would be helpful if you could label the name of your dish with a tent card. Don't forget your serving utensils and extension/power cord (if needed). Water and coffee will be provided.

We are requesting that each member attending donate 1 gently-used, new, or hand-crafted gardening item for the auction. All items should be garden or plant-related in some way, such as pots, gardening tools, gardening books, bird houses, new houseplants, etc.

Drop off instructions: Bring your auction item with you to the meeting. You will need to fill out an "Auction Item" sheet that includes a brief description of the item you are donating. Auction sheets will be available at the meeting. It would also be helpful if you could bring a pencil/pen to the meeting. If you want to fill it out in advance, print out the form on page 9.

Reminder: Silent Auction bids are only in "Garden Bucks" which are earned by members by participating in the club.

When you arrive you will pick up your "Bid Number" at our Welcome Table with Jean Ann. When you find an item you want to bid on, you will enter your bid number and your Garden Bucks \$ amount on the "Auction Item" sheet. Do NOT erase your bids when you want to rebid on an item. Simply write your bid # and a new higher bucks \$ amount on a NEW line on the auction sheet. Please note: Garden Dollar Change will not be given for auction items. Please plan accordingly.

Once again there are a few gift cards from local garden centers available for the auction. You are only able to win 1 gift card that evening. You

are, however, able to win multiple non-gift card auction items. Highest bid wins the item!

Bidding may be done at any time during the meeting until the announcement that the auction is closed for that particular section/table. There is no reserve.

You must take all items won with you that night, as there is no storage at the church.

Remember to bring your Garden Bucks!

Nature Notes—Jabs

Recently I got my flu and covid vaccinations. The needle was so thin, I hardly felt a thing. The vaccines are protecting me from some bad stuff.

I recall hearing that the U.S Dept. of Agriculture approved a vaccine for honeybees. It protects the pollinators against a disease capable of wiping out entire bee colonies.



Do beekeepers use teeny, tiny syringes to administer the vaccine? Time to do some research!



According to the Nature Journal, Jan 2023, beekeepers mix the vaccine, which contains dead bacteria cells, into the food that worker bees eat. When the worker bees secrete their royal jelly, the queen ingests it and the vaccine. Then, the vaccine goes to her ovaries, where it immunizes developing larvae.
