# **Toffee Nut Bars**

# **Ingredients:**

2 sticks butter (1 cup) – no substitutes

l cup light brown sugar

l egg yolk l tsp vanilla 2 cups flour

1 10 oz. barHershey's Chocolate

l cup nut meats (pecans or walnuts)

### **Directions:**

Cream butter and sugar

Add egg yolk, vanilla and flour.

Spread mixture on a 10" x 14" cookie sheet.

Bake in a 350 degree oven for 15 to 20 minutes.

Break up chocolate bar and evenly distribute over the dough.

Put back in oven for about 3 minutes.

Spread chocolate when melted.

Press nuts into the chocolate.

Cut into squares while warm.

Yield: approximately 4 dozen











# **Raspberry Almond Shortbread Thumbprints**

# **Ingredients:**

2 sticks butter (1 cup) softened

2/3 cup sugar

1/2 tsp. almond extract2 cups all purpose flour1/2 cup raspberry jam

### **Directions:**

- 1. Heat oven to 350 degrees.
- 2. In a large bowl, combine sugar, butter and almond extract. Beat at medium speed, scraping bowl often, until creamy (1 to 2 minutes).
- 3. Reduce speed to low, add flour. Continue beating until well mixed (1 to 2 minutes).
- 4. Shape dough into 1 inch balls. Place balls 2 inches apart on cookie sheets.
- 5. With thumb, make indentation in center of each cookie ball (edges may crack slightly).
- 6. Fill each indentation with about 1/4 tsp. of jam.
- 7. Bake for 14 to 18 minutes or until edges are lightly browned.
- 8. Let stand for 1 minute then remove from cookie sheet.

# Glaze:

1 cup powdered sugar1-1/2 tsp. almond extract

2 to 3 tsp. water

In small bowl, stir together powdered sugar and almond extract.

Gradually stir in enough water for a thin glaze.

Drizzle over cooled cookies.

Yield: approximately 3-1/2 dozen cookies

# Tips:

Substitute 1/2 cup of your favorite jam.

Store in airtight container up to 1 week or freeze for up to 3 months.

If cookies are spreading too much, chill dough for 1 hour or stir in 1 to 2 tbsp. flour.
