October Program – Spring Bulbs for the Garden

Speaker Sandy Klausman

Sandy Klausman's presentation focused on daffodils, but touched on several bulbs. Although the daffodil bulb is poisonous, it is very hardy and does well in clay soil. Wildlife will not bother daffodils, while digging up most other bulbs. Sandy cleared up the age-old question...what is the difference between Daffodils, Narcissus, and Jonquils? Actually, nothing; they are all names for the same bulb. Daffodil is the American name, Narcissus is the Latin name and Jonquil is a specific class of Daffodil.

The speaker showed us some bulb samples and noted that when choosing bulbs, they should be firm, not soft, and the tunic (brown covering) is not required to ensure a good bulb. 'Top size' is the largest size bulb for that type of bulb for that year. When dividing bulbs Sandy said you should be sure that each division has part of the basal plate (the flat part on the bottom of the bulb where the roots develop). She also suggested if you naturalize bulbs in your lawn, you should

wait until at least 6 – 8 weeks after they bloom to mow the grass, otherwise the bulbs won't die back properly and may not come up the following year.

While Sandy has purchased bulbs from stores such as Menards and Franks, she has sometimes been surprised to find that the bulbs were not always properly marked. She endorsed three of her favorite catalog suppliers: Dutch Gardens, Van Engelen, and John Scheepers.

The slide presentation started with early-blooming bulbs, and showed varieties that bloom through the season. The slides were mostly of her gardens and included samples of Snow Crocus; Purple Sensation Allium; Tarda and Toronto Tulips; February Gold, Las Vegas, Cheerfulness, and Ice Winks Daffodils just to name a few.

Sandy's presentation was very informative and motivating. I don't know about you, but I felt like buying some bulbs, planting them and waiting for the big surprise in spring!


